- (2) Students will revise skills of paragraphs writing from previous courses and will combine these skills with new essay writing techniques focusing on various types of essays i.e. Narrative, Comparison, Cause-effect and argumentative essays
- (3) Students will be enabled through instruction to present their work on a collaborative, online platform in a self-designed, student styled blog/website format.
